- Clinical canine massage supports and assists the muscular system, it is designed to help resolve common muscular issues such as myofascial pain, trigger points, rehabilitate/recondition soft tissue injuries. Supporting orthopaedic conditions, mobility, movement and pain management, which can have a detrimental affect on behaviour and quality of life.
- I specialise in the use of Myofascial Release, Remedial Sports Massage, Deep Tissue Massage and Swedish Massage as well as the Lenton Method: a set of direct Myofascial release protocols designed specifically to suite the dog's anatomy and LED Light Therapy; pulsating red and infra-red LED phototherapy, complementing canine massage to enhance and maximize the positive effects.
- Body mapping; understanding common areas of muscular injury, Myofascial pain and active trigger points, using a systematic palpation routine assessing muscles from origin and insertion to fibre direction.
- Please note that I do not manipulate joints or the skeleton as part of my work, and concentrate purely on the application of safe, structured massage techniques.
- Canine Massage is an affordable treatment that not only assists dogs and their owners through recovery, recuperation and rehabilitation, it is also used as preventative healthcare; helping dogs to maintain a happy and healthy life.
- Working closely with owners and their dogs, I tailor each treatment and aftercare plan to meet their individual needs and ensuring the best results.
- By working closely with Veterinarians, physiotherapists and other therapists in a multimodal approach we can achieve the best possible results for the wellness of the dogs we treat.
